

The Australian Bureau of Statistics, with contributions by the then Department of Employment, Education, Training and Youth Affairs, conducted the research for the second edition of the *ASCO Dictionary*. It is a skills-based classification. This PDF file reproduces the lead statements for the major group, sub-major group, unit group and occupation entries, some of which have been shortened. Major Group 1

Managers and Administrators head government, legislative, industrial, commercial, agricultural and other establishments, or departments within these organisations. They determine the policy of the organisation or department, and direct its functioning, usually through other managers, and coordinate economic, social, technical, legal and other policies.

Sub-Major Group 11

Generalist Managers interpret, analyse, administer and review the law and public policy or determine the overall direction of the organisations they represent. They also administer businesses conducting operations such as building and construction, importing, exporting, wholesaling and manufacturing.

Unit Group 1111

Legislators and Government Appointed Officials represent the people, the nation or the Crown in elected bodies, courts of law and overseas diplomatic missions. They interpret, analyse, administer and review the law and public policy and promote the interest of the constituencies they represent.

Occupation 111111

A Parliamentarian or Councillor participates in the activities of Commonwealth, State/Territory or local governments as the elected member for a constituency.

Occupation 111113

A Judge presides over civil and criminal proceedings in courts of law.

Occupation 111115

A Magistrate hears criminal matters to determine whether defendants will be committed for trial and adjudicate minor criminal offences without a jury.

Occupation 111117

A Tribunal Member hears industrial, administrative and other disputes to assist in resolving differences and to arbitrate on issues.

Occupation 111179

A Legislator and Government Appointed Official *nec* interprets, analyses, administers and reviews the law and public policy.

Unit Group 1112

General Managers plan, administer and review the major functions of industrial, commercial or government organisations either independently or through subordinate executives.

Occupation 111211

A General Manager plans, administers and reviews the major functions of industrial, commercial and government organisations, either independently or through subordinate executives.

Unit Group 1191

Building and Construction Managers plan, organise and administer the activities of businesses conducting operations in building and construction.

Occupation 119111

A Construction Project Manager manages the construction of buildings and other structures and organises the physical and human resources involved in the construction process.

Occupation 119113

A Project Builder manages the construction of dwellings and other buildings.

Unit Group 1192

Importers, Exporters and Wholesalers plan, organise and administer the activities of businesses conducting operations in importing, exporting and wholesale trade.

Occupation 119211

An Importer or Exporter plans, organises and administers the operations of a business which imports or exports goods.

Occupation 119213

A Wholesaler plans and organises the operations of a wholesale trading establishment.

Unit Group 1193

Manufacturers plan, organise and administer the operations of establishments manufacturing goods.

Occupation 119311

A Manufacturer plans, organises and administers the operations of establishments manufacturing goods.

Sub-Major Group 12

Specialist Managers coordinate the administration and operation of specialised functions or fields of activity within an organisation. Under broad direction from the general Manager, they plan, administer and review the financial, corporate, personnel, supply and distribution, information technology, sales and marketing, and other specialised activities of an organisation.

Unit Group 1211

Finance Managers plan, administer and review the financial and accounting activities within organisations.

Occupation 121111

A Finance Manager plans, administers and reviews the financial and accounting activities within an organisation.

Unit Group 1212

Company Secretaries plan, administer and review corporate compliance activities and effective practice concerning company board meetings and shareholdings.

Occupation 121211

A Company Secretary plans, administers and reviews corporate compliance activities and effective practice concerning company board meetings and shareholdings.

Unit Group 1213

Human Resource Managers plan, administer and review activities concerned with staff selection, training and development, conditions of employment and other human resource issues within organisations.

Occupation 121311

A Human Resource Manager plans, administers and reviews activities concerned with staff selection, training and development, conditions of employment and other human resource issues within an organisation.

Unit Group 1221

Engineering Managers plan, administer and review engineering and technical operations.

Occupation 122111

Engineering Manager plans, administers and reviews engineering and technical operations.

Unit Group 1222

Production Managers plan, administer and review the overall production activities of manufacturing and mining organisations to optimise resource use, minimise costs and maintain quality standards.

Occupation 122211

A Production Manager (Manufacturing) plans, administers and reviews the manufacturing activities of an organisation to optimise resource use, minimise costs and maintain quality standards.

Occupation 122213

A Production Manager (Mining) plans, administers and reviews the activities of mining operations to optimise resource use, minimise costs and maintain quality standards.

Unit Group 1223

Supply and Distribution Managers plan, administer and review the supply, storage and distribution of equipment, materials and goods used and produced by organisations.

Occupation 122311

A Supply and Distribution Manager plans, administers and reviews the supply, storage and distribution of equipment, materials and goods used and produced by an organisation.

Unit Group 1224

Information Technology Managers plan, administer and review the acquisition, development, maintenance and use of computer and telecommunication systems within organisations.

Occupation 122411

An Information Technology Manager plans, administers and reviews the acquisition, development, maintenance and use of computer and telecommunications systems within an organisation.

Unit Group 1231

Sales and Marketing Managers plan and direct the sales and marketing activities of organisations.

Occupation 123111

A Sales and Marketing Manager plans and directs the sales and marketing activities of an organisation.

Unit Group 1291

Policy and Planning Managers plan, develop, administer and review policy advice and strategic planning within a government agency or corporate business.

Occupation 129111

A Policy and Planning Manager plans, develops, administers and reviews policy advice and strategic planning within a government agency or corporate business.

Unit Group 1292

Health Services Managers direct and manage the professional and administrative aspects of health programs and clinical services in health service facilities, and maintain standards of patient care.

Occupation 129211

A Director of Nursing directs and manages nursing programs and clinical services in hospitals, nursing homes and other health service facilities and maintains standards of nursing care.

Occupation 129213

A Medical Administrator directs and manages the professional activities of medical staff in hospitals, health services and health service facilities.

Unit Group 1293

Education Managers administer educational institutions.

Occupation 129311

A School Principal manages the educational operations and administration of a primary or secondary school.

Occupation 129313

A Faculty Head administers and implements policy, and provides advice and administrative support to staff and students in universities or other tertiary institutions such as TAFEs.

Occupation 129315

A Regional Education Manager provides support to pre-school, primary, secondary or TAFE teachers and administrators in regard to educational approaches and policy, curriculum resources and development.

Occupation 129379

Education Manager nec administers educational institutions or major educational projects.

Unit Group 1294

Commissioned Officers (Management) provide high level management to support the armed services, fire or police organisations.

Occupation 129411

A Commissioned Defence Force Officer provides high level management to support the running of an organisational unit within the Australian Defence Forces.

Occupation 129413

A Commissioned Fire Officer provides high level management to support the running of a geographic operational section of a fire service.

Occupation 129415

A Commissioned Police Officer provides high-level management to support the running of police operations and manages the activities of geographical or operational sections of a police force.

Occupation 129481

A Trainee Commissioned Defence Force Officer studies and trains as a member of the Australian Defence Forces, so as to perform the tasks of a Commissioned Defence Force officer.

Unit Group 1295

Child Care Co-ordinators direct the activities of a child care centre or service.

Occupation 129511

A Child Care Co-ordinator directs the activities of a child care centre or service.

Unit Group 1296

Media Producers and Artistic Directors plan, administer and review activities concerned with producing artistic media, such as film, television and theatre, or determine artistic policies for performing arts organisations, such as theatre companies, dance companies and music ensembles.

Occupation 129611

A Media Producer plans, administers and reviews activities concerned with producing artistic media, such as film, television and theatre.

Occupation 129613

An Artistic Director determines artistic policies for performing arts organisations, such as theatre companies, dance companies and music ensembles.

Unit Group 1299

Other Specialist Managers this unit group includes all specialist managers not elsewhere classified.

Occupation 129911

A Research and Development Manager plans, administers and reviews research and development activities of an organisation.

Occupation 129913

A Laboratory Manager manages the operations and organisation of a research or production laboratory.

Occupation 129915

A Welfare Centre Manager manages and co-ordinate centres, programs or projects concerned with social welfare support.

Occupation 129917

Environment, Parks and Land Care Manager manages and develops conservation plans for nature parks, land and other natural resources.

Occupation 129919

A Sports Administrator manages and promotes sport and recreational activities and develop related policies.

Occupation 129979

A Specialist Manager nec co-ordinates the administration and operation of specialised functions or fields of activity within an organisation.

Sub-Major Group 13

Farmers and Farm Managers plan, direct, coordinate and perform farming activities in agricultural establishments.

Unit Group 1311

Mixed Crop and Livestock Farmers plan, direct, coordinate and perform farming operations to breed and raise livestock and to grow crops.

Occupation 131111

A Mixed Crop and Livestock Farmer plans, directs, co-ordinates and performs farming operations to breed and raise livestock and to grow crops.

Unit Group 1312

Livestock Farmers plan, direct, coordinate and perform farming operations to breed and raise livestock.

Occupation 131211

A Mixed Livestock Farmer plans, directs, co-ordinates and performs farming operations to breed and raise mixed livestock.

Occupation 131213

A Beef Cattle Farmer plans, directs, co-ordinates and performs farming operations to breed and raise beef cattle for meat production and breeding stock.

Occupation 131215

A Dairy Farmer plans, directs, co-ordinates and performs farming operations to breed and raise dairy cattle for milk, breeding stock and meat.

Occupation 131217

A Sheep Farmer plans, directs, co-ordinates and performs farming operations to breed and raise sheep for the production of wool, meat and breeding stock.

Occupation 131219

A Pig Farmer plans, directs, co-ordinates and performs farming operations to breed and raise pigs for the production of meat and breeding stock.

Occupation 131221

A Poultry Farmer plans, directs, co-ordinates and performs farming operations to breed and raise chickens, turkeys, ducks and other poultry for egg and meat production.

Occupation 131223

A Horse Breeder plans, directs, co-ordinates and performs farming operations to breed horses.

Occupation 131225

An Apiarist plans, directs, co-ordinates and operates apiaries to produce honey, queen bee pollen, beeswax, royal and jelly, and to pollinate crops.

Occupation 131279

A Livestock Farmer nec plans, directs, co-ordinates and performs farming operations to breed and raise livestock.

Unit Group 1313

Crop Farmers plan, direct, coordinate and perform farming operations to grow crops.

Occupation 131311

A Grain, Oilseed and Pasture Grower plans, directs, co-ordinates and performs farming operations to grow grain, oilseed, protein and pasture crops.

Occupation 131313

A Sugar Cane Grower plans, directs, co-ordinates and performs farming operations to grow sugar cane.

Occupation 131315

A Tobacco Grower plans, directs, co-ordinates and performs farming operations to grow tobacco.

Occupation 131317

A Fruit and Nut Grower plans, directs, co-ordinates and performs farming operations to grow fruit and nuts.

Occupation 131319

A Vegetable Grower plans, directs, co-ordinates and performs farming operations to grow vegetables.

Occupation 131321

A Flower Grower plans, directs, co-ordinates and performs planting, cultivating and harvesting activities to grow flowering and foliage plants.

Occupation 131379

A Crop Farmer nec plans, directs, co-ordinates and performs farming operations to grow crops.

Unit Group 1314

Aquaculture Farmers plan, direct, coordinate and perform farming operations to breed and raise fish and other aquatic stock.

Occupation 131411

An Aquaculture Farmer plans, directs, co-ordinates and performs farming operations to breed and raise fish and other aquatic stock.

Major Group 2

Professionals perform analytical, conceptual and creative tasks through the application of theoretical knowledge and experience in the fields of science, engineering, business and information, health, education, social welfare and the arts.

Sub-Major Group 21

Science, Building and Engineering Professionals perform analytical, conceptual and practical tasks in relation to the chemical and physical properties of the universe, life forms and the environment and the design and function of machines, production systems and structures.

Unit Group 2111

Chemists study the chemical and physical properties of substances and develop and monitor chemical processes and production.

Occupation 211111

A Chemist studies the chemical and physical properties of substances and develops and monitors chemical processes and production.

Unit Group 2112

Geologists and Geophysicists study physical aspects of the earth to determine its structure and composition, locate and advise on the extraction of minerals, petroleum or ground water; and detect, monitor and forecast seismic, magnetic, electrical, thermal and oceanographic activity.

Occupation 211211

A Geologist studies physical aspects of the earth to determine its structure and composition, and to locate and advise on the extraction of minerals, petroleum or ground water.

Occupation 211213

A Geophysicist studies physical aspects of the earth to determine its structure and composition, locate minerals, petroleum or ground water and to detect, monitor and forecast seismic, magnetic, electrical, thermal and oceanographic activity.

Unit Group 2113

Life Scientists examine the anatomy, physiology and biochemistry of humans, animals, plants and other living organisms.

Occupation 211311

An Anatomist or Physiologist studies the anatomy or physiology of humans.

Occupation 211313

A Botanist studies the anatomy, physiology, biochemistry and ecology of plants.

Occupation 211315

A Zoologist studies the anatomy, physiology, characteristics and environments of plants.

Occupation 211317

A Biochemist studies the biochemistry of living organisms.

Occupation 211319

A Marine Biologist studies the anatomy, physiology, characteristics and environments of marine animals and plants.

Occupation 211379

A Life Scientist nec examines the anatomy, physiology and biochemistry of humans, animals, plants and other living organisms.

Unit Group 2114

Environmental and Agricultural Science Professionals study and develop plans and policies for the environment, management of forest areas, flora and fauna, develop techniques for increased productivity, and advise farmers on various aspects of farming.

Occupation 211411

Environmental Research Scientist studies and develops policies and plans for the control of factors which may produce pollution, imbalance or degradation of the environment.

Occupation 211413

A Forester studies, develops and manages forest areas to maintain commercial and recreational uses, conserve flora and fauna, and protect against fire, pests and diseases.

Occupation 211415

A Park Ranger controls state or national parks, scenic areas, historic sites, nature reserves, recreation areas or conservation reserves in accordance with authorised policies and priorities.

Occupation 211417

A Soil Scientist studies the location, composition and characteristics of soils to improve soil management, ensure soil conservation, classify soil types and increase soil productivity.

Occupation 211419

An Agricultural Scientist studies commercial plants, animals and cultivation techniques to enhance the productivity of farms and agricultural industries.

Occupation 211421

An Agricultural Adviser advises farmers, agricultural businesses, rural industries and government in the production, processing and distribution of farm products.

Occupation 211479

Environmental and Agricultural Science Professional nec studies and develops plans and policies relating to the environment, forests and farming.

Unit Group 2115

Medical Scientists conduct medical laboratory tests to develop applications for the diagnosis, treatment and prevention of disease and testing of drugs for therapeutic use.

Occupation 211511

A Medical Scientist conducts medical laboratory tests to develop applications for the diagnosis, treatment and prevention of disease and testing of drugs for therapeutic use.

Unit Group 2119

Other Natural and Physical Science Professionals this unit group includes all natural and physical science professionals not elsewhere classified.

Occupation 211911

A Physicist studies the structure and physical properties of matter and the relationships and interactions of matter and energy in order to develop and improve materials, products, industrial and other processes.

Occupation 211913

A Meteorologist studies the physics and dynamics of the atmosphere to increase understanding of weather and climate, and to forecast changes in the weather.

Occupation 211915

Extractive Metallurgist researches, develops, controls and provides advice on processes used in extracting metals from their ores and the washing, crushing and grading of ore or refining metals.

Occupation 211917

A Physical Metallurgist researches, develops, controls and provides advice on processes for casting, alloying, heat treating or welding refined metals, alloys and other materials to produce commercial metal product or develop new alloys or processes.

Occupation 211919

A Materials Scientist studies the properties and uses of non-metallic materials and advises on the technical aspects of their manufacture and processing.

Occupation 211979

A Natural and Physical Science Professional nec performs analytical, conceptual and practical tasks in the natural and physical sciences.

Unit Group 2121

Architects and Landscape Architects design commercial, industrial, institutional, residential or recreational buildings or landscapes.

Occupation 212111

An Architect designs buildings or advise on the procurement of buildings, provides concepts, plans, specifications and detailed drawings, and negotiates with builders.

Occupation 212113

A Landscape Architect plans and designs land areas for projects such as open space networks, parks, schools, institutions, roads, external areas for all building types, land subdivisions, and commercial, industrial and residential sites.

Unit Group 2122

Quantity Surveyors estimate and monitor construction costs from the feasibility stage, through tender preparation, to the construction period and beyond.

Occupation 212211

Quantity Surveyor estimates and monitors constructions costs from the feasibility stage, through tender preparation, to the construction period and beyond.

Unit Group 2123

Cartographers and Surveyors apply scientific and mathematical principles to design, prepare and revise maps and charts or plan, direct and conduct survey work to determine, delineate, plan and precisely position tracts of land, natural and constructed features, coastlines, marine floors and underground works and manage related information systems.

Occupation 212311

A Cartographer applies scientific and mathematical principles to design, prepare and revise maps and charts.

Occupation 212313

A Surveyor plans, directs and conducts survey work to determine, delineate, plan and precisely position tracts of land, natural and constructed features, coastlines, marine floors and underground works and manage information systems.

Unit Group 2124

Civil Engineers plan, design, organise and oversee the construction and operation of civil engineering projects such as structural, transportation or hydraulic engineering systems

Occupation 212411

A Civil Engineer plans, designs, organises and oversees the construction and operation of civil engineering projects such as structural transportation or hydraulic engineering systems.

Unit Group 2125

Electrical and Electronics Engineers design, develop and supervise the manufacture, installation, operation and maintenance of electrical systems for the generation, distribution, utilisation and control of electric power or electronic systems used for computer systems, communication systems and other industrial applications.

Occupation 212511

Electrical Engineer designs, develops and supervises the manufacture, installation, operation and maintenance of equipment, machines and systems for the generation, distribution, utilisation and control of electric power.

Occupation 212513

Electronics Engineer designs, develops, adapts, installs, tests and maintains electronic components, circuits and systems used for computer systems, communications systems and other industrial applications.

Unit Group 2126

Mechanical, Production and Plant Engineers design, organise and oversee the construction, operation and maintenance of mechanical and process plant and installations and establish programs for the coordination of manufacturing activities.

Occupation 212611

A Mechanical Engineer designs, organises and oversees the construction, operation and maintenance of mechanical and process plant and installations and establishes programs for the co-ordination of manufacturing activities.

Occupation 212613

A Production or Plant Engineer plans, directs and co-ordinates the design, construction, modification, continued performance and maintenance of equipment and machinery in industrial plants and the management and planning of manufacturing activities.

Unit Group 2127

Mining and Materials Engineers plan and direct the engineering aspects of locating and extracting minerals, petroleum and natural gas from the earth, and the engineering and commercial application of materials, manufacturing processes, products and related technologies.

Occupation 212711

A Mining Engineer (excluding Petroleum) plans and directs the engineering aspects of locating and extracting minerals from the earth.

Occupation 212713

A Petroleum Engineer plans and directs the engineering aspects of locating and extracting petroleum and natural gas from the earth.

Occupation 212715

A Materials Engineer plans and directs the engineering and commercial application of materials, manufacturing processes, products and related technologies.

Unit Group 2128

Engineering Technologists apply and modify established engineering practices such as the design and implementation of civil, mechanical, electrical or electronic engineering projects.

Occupation 212811

A Civil Engineering Technologist applies and modifies established engineering practices with regard to the design and implementation of civil engineering projects.

Occupation 212813

A Mechanical Engineering Technologist applies and modifies established engineering practices with regard to the design and implementation of mechanical engineering projects.

Occupation 212815

Electrical or Electronics Engineering Technologist applies and modifies established engineering practices with regard to the design and implementation of electrical or electronic engineering projects.

Occupation 212879

Engineering Technologist nec applies and modifies established engineering practices with regard to the design and implementation of engineering projects other than civil, mechanical or electrical/electronic.

Unit Group 2129

Other Building and Engineering Professionals this unit group includes all building and engineering professionals not elsewhere classified.

Occupation 212911

An Aeronautical Engineer performs and supervises engineering work concerned with the design, development, manufacture, maintenance and modification of aircraft for flight.

Occupation 212913

An Agricultural Engineer performs and supervises engineering work related to the use and development of agricultural land, buildings, machinery and equipment.

Occupation 212915

A Biomedical Engineer applies knowledge and methodology of physics, engineering, mathematics, computing, physical chemistry and materials science to problems in biology and the treatment and prevention of human disease.

Occupation 212917

A Chemical Engineer designs and prepares specifications for chemical process systems and the construction and operation of commercial-scale chemical plants, and supervises industrial processing and fabrication of products undergoing physical and chemical changes.

Occupation 212919

An Industrial Engineer investigates and reviews the utilisation of personnel, facilities, equipment and materials, operational processes and established practices, to recommend improvements in the efficient operation of commercial, industrial and production environments.

Occupation 212921

A Naval Architect designs and oversees the construction and repair of marine craft and floating structures.

Occupation 212979

Engineering Technologist nec performs analytical, conceptual and creative tasks in relation to the design and function of structures, machines, production systems and resources or products.

Sub-Major Group 22

Business and Information Professionals plan, develop, coordinate and implement programs and systems to provide services in accounting, sales, computing, publicity, staff development and training; conduct studies of organisational structures, methods and systems; and develop new techniques and applications in these areas.

Unit Group 2211

Accountants plan and provide systems and services relating to the financial dealings of enterprises and individuals, and advise on associated record keeping and compliance requirements.

Occupation 221111

An Accountant plans and provides systems and services relating to the financial dealings of enterprises and individuals, and advises on associated record-keeping and compliance requirements.

Unit Group 2212

Auditors design and operate information and reporting systems to meet external financial reporting requirements and examine, verify and report on financial and managerial systems and outcomes to ensure compliance.

Occupation 221211

External Auditor designs and operates information and reporting systems to meet external financial reporting requirements.

Occupation 221213

An Internal Auditor examines, verifies and reports on financial, operational and managerial processes, systems and outcomes to ensure financial and operational integrity and compliance.

Unit Group 2213

Corporate Treasurers manage corporate funding, liquidity and financial risk associated with the profitable development and operation of a business.

Occupation 221311

A Corporate Treasurer manages corporate funding, liquidity and financial risk associated with the profitable developments and operation of a business.

Unit Group 2221

Marketing and Advertising Professionals plan, develop, coordinate and implement programs of information dissemination to promote a favourable view of an organisation, products and services and to increase market share.

Occupation 222111

A Public Relations Officer plans, develops, co-ordinates and implements programs of information dissemination to create an understanding and a favourable view of an organisation, its products services and role in the community.

Occupation 222113

A Marketing Specialist identifies the market opportunities and advises on the development, co-ordination and implementation of plans for the pricing and promotion of an organisation's products or services.

Occupation 222115

A Market Research Analyst determines the market for new products, develop advertising strategies and evaluates the best business sites for various types of commercial enterprises.

Occupation 222117

An Advertising Specialist plans, develops, co-ordinates and implements campaigns to inform the organisation's target market of the merits of purchasing particular products, services and buying from the organisation in general.

Unit Group 2222

Technical Sales Representatives represent companies in selling a range of industrial, technical, medical and pharmaceutical goods and services to industrial, business, professional or other establishments.

Occupation 222211

A Sales Representative (Industrial Products) represents companies in selling a range of specialised chemicals, manufacturing materials or other industrial supplies.

Occupation 222213

A Sales Representative (Information and Communication Products) represents companies in selling information and communications equipment, systems and solutions to businesses.

Occupation 222215

A Sales Representative (Medical and Pharmaceutical Products) represents companies in selling medical, dental or veterinary equipment, supplies and pharmaceutical products.

Occupation 222279

A Technical Sales Representative nec represents companies in selling technical equipment, systems and solutions to business and government organisations (for example educational products and services).

Unit Group 2231

Computing Professionals design and prepare software to meet specific requirements in all aspects of the computing environment, and control and audit the operation of computing facilities within an organisation.

Occupation 223111

A Systems Manager controls the operating effectiveness of information technology systems, and arranges system maintenance and enhancements to meet user requirements.

Occupation 223113

A Systems Designer conducts research into computer and communications systems, and develops techniques for their effective application and use.

Occupation 223115

A Software Designer designs and modifies the operating environment software which links computer software and hardware.

Occupation 223117

An Applications and Analyst Programmer writes, tests and maintains computer programs to meet the application needs of end-users of computer systems.

Occupation 223119

A Systems Programmer writes, maintains and updates programs which control the overall functioning of computers.

Occupation 223121

A Computer Systems Auditor designs and monitors systems which ensure the integrity and security of data and review the organisation's computing environment and usage of computer facilities.

Occupation 223179

Computing Professional nec designs and prepares software to meet specific requirements in computing environments, and control of computing facilities within an organisation.

Unit Group 2291

Human Resource Professionals plan, develop, implement and evaluate staff recruitment, training and development programs and assist in resolving disputes by advising on industrial relations policies and problems, and representing industrial, commercial, union, employer or other organisations in negotiations.

A Personnel Officer provides staffing and personnel administration services in support of an organisation's human resources policies and programs.

Occupation 229113

A Personnel Consultant interviews applicants to determine their job requirements and suitability for particular jobs, and assists employers to find suitable staff.

Occupation 229115

An Industrial Relations Officer assists in resolving disputes by advising on industrial relations policies and problems, and representing industrial, commercial, union, employer or other organisations in negotiations.

Occupation 229117

A Training Officer plans, develops, implements and evaluates training and development programs, to ensure management and staff acquire the skills and develop the competencies required by the organisation.

Unit Group 2292

Librarians develop, organise and maintain library services including collections of information, recreational resources and reader information services.

Occupation 229211

A Librarian develops, organises and maintains library services including collections of information, recreational resources and reader information services.

Unit Group 2293

Mathematicians, Statisticians and Actuaries apply mathematical, statistical and actuarial principles and techniques to a range of tasks including scientific research; designing statistical collections; studying financial policy, analysing financial risk and investment issues; and solving engineering, management and other problems.

Occupation 229311

A Mathematician uses and develops mathematical principles and techniques to solve problems in science, engineering, management and other fields.

Occupation 229313

A Statistician collects, organises and interprets quantitative data and use statistical methodologies to produce statistical reports and analyses for government, commercial and other planning purposes.

Occupation 229315

An Actuary applies mathematical, statistical and economic analyses to a wide range of practical problems in areas of finance such as insurance, superannuation and investment.

Unit Group 2294

Business and Organisation Analysts conduct studies of organisational structures, methods, systems and procedures used in industrial establishments and other organisations to achieve greater efficiency and solve organisational problems, or to facilitate an environment of continuous improvement with the major focus on customer requirements.

Occupation 229411

A Management Consultant assists clients to achieve greater efficiency in a business or organisation and solves organisational problems in fields such as personnel, information systems, finance, research and general business strategy.

Occupation 229413

Organisation and Methods Analyst studies organisational structures, methods, systems and procedures used in industrial establishments and other organisations.

Occupation 229415

Quality Assurance Manager facilitates a continuous improvement environment in which organisational resources are focused on satisfying internal and external customer requirements.

Unit Group 2295

Property Professionals assess the value of land, property, and other items such as commercial equipment and objects of art; and provide advice on the administration and commercial and operational use of land and property.

Occupation 229511

A Valuer assesses the value of land, property, commercial equipment, merchandise, personal effects, household goods and objects of art.

Occupation 229513

A Land Economist provides advice on the administration and commercial and operational use of land and property.

Unit Group 2299

Other Business and Information Professionals this unit group includes all business and information professionals not elsewhere classified.

Occupation 229911

A Health Information Manager designs, implements and administers medical record systems and information services in accordance with legal and confidentiality requirements.

Occupation 229913

A Records Manager designs, implements and administers record systems and related information services, to support efficient access, movement, updating and storage of files and other organisational records.

Occupation 229915

An Archivist plans and organises systems and procedures for the safekeeping of records and historically valuable documents.

Occupation 229917

A Policy Analyst analyses and advises on policies guiding the design, implementation and modification of government and commercial operations and programs.

Occupation 229919

An Intelligence Officer manages the collection and processing of data to produce intelligence for public and private sector organisations in their planning, operations and personnel functions.

Occupation 229979

A Business and Information Professional nec plans, develops, co-ordinates and implements programs and systems in the business and information fields not covered by other occupations.

Sub-Major Group 23

Health Professionals diagnose and treat physical and mental illnesses and conditions and recommend, administer, dispense and develop medications and treatment to promote or restore good health.

Unit Group 2311

Generalist Medical Practitioners diagnose and treat physical and mental illnesses, disorders and injuries, recommend preventive action and refer patients to specialist medical practitioners.

Occupation 231111

A General Medical Practitioner diagnoses and treats physical and mental illnesses, disorders and injuries, recommends preventive action and refers patients to specialist medical practitioners.

Occupation 231181

A Medical Practitioner in Training undertakes diagnosis, treatment and prevention of human physical and mental disorders and injuries, under the supervision of specialists or senior general practitioners.

Unit Group 2312

Specialist Medical Practitioners diagnose and treat physical and mental diseases and disorders using specialist testing, diagnostic, medical and surgical techniques. Medical Registrars who are training as Specialist Medical Practitioners are included in this unit group.

Occupation 231211

An Anaesthetist administers anaesthetics to prevent pain and maintain major body function throughout surgical and related procedures.

Occupation 231213

A Dermatologist provides diagnostic, treatment and preventative medical services related to human skin disorders.

Occupation 231215

Emergency Medicine Specialist diagnoses and manages patients with acute and urgent illness and injury.

Occupation 231217

Obstetrician and Gynaecologist provides diagnostic, treatment and preventative medical services related to disorders of the female genital, urinary, rectal and reproductive organs, and the care of women during pregnancy and childbirth.

Occupation 231219

Ophthalmologist provides diagnostic, treatment and preventative medical services related to diseases, injuries and deficiencies of the human eye and related structures.

Occupation 231221

A Paediatrician provides specialist medical services to children from birth up to and including adolescence.

Occupation 231223

A Pathologist identifies and diagnoses the presence and stages of diseases and possible sources of infection in body tissues, fluids, secretions and other specimens.

Occupation 231225

A Specialist Physician investigates and diagnoses internal human disorders and diseases, and administers treatments.

Occupation 231227

A Psychiatrist diagnoses, treats and prevents human mental, emotional and behavioural disorders.

Occupation 231229

A Radiologist diagnoses and treats diseases of the human body using radiant energies such as X-rays, ultrasound, gamma rays and radio waves.

Occupation 231231

A Surgeon performs surgery to correct deformities, repair injuries, prevent and treat diseases and improve human body functions and appearances.

Occupation 231279

A Specialist Medical Practitioner nec diagnoses and treats physical and mental illnesses and disorders using specialist testing, diagnosis, medical and surgical techniques.

Unit Group 2321

Nurse Managers manage a hospital nursing care unit or other sub unit of a hospital, nursing home or health care facility, or supervise nursing staff for a particular unit or shift.

Occupation 232111

A Nurse Manager manages a hospital nursing care unit or other sub-unit of a hospital, nursing home or health care facility, or manages the work of nursing staff on a particular unit or shift.

Unit Group 2322

Nurse Educators and Researchers provide education and professional development of nurses and research nursing practice.

Occupation 232211

A Nurse Educator assesses, plans, implements and evaluates nursing education and professional development programs.

Occupation 232213

A Nurse Researcher conducts research into nursing issues.

Unit Group 2323

Registered Nurses provide nursing care for patients in hospitals, nursing homes, extended care facilities or other health care facilities and in the community.

Occupation 232311

A Registered Nurse provides nursing care for patients in hospitals, nursing homes, extended care facilities or other health care facilities and in the community.

Unit Group 2324

Registered Midwives provide care and advice during pregnancy, labour and birth and provide postnatal care for women and babies.

Occupation 232411

A Registered Midwife provides care and advice during pregnancy, labour and birth, and provides postnatal care for women and babies.

Occupation 238713

An Osteopath diagnoses, treats and provides preventative advice on physiological and mechanical disorders of the human locomotor system.

Unit Group 2388

Podiatrists prevent, diagnose and treat medical and surgical conditions of the feet, including those resulting from bone and joint disorders, muscular pathologies as well as neurological and circulatory diseases.

Occupation 238811

A Podiatrist prevents, diagnoses and treats medical and surgical conditions of the feet, including those resulting from bone and joint disorders, muscular pathologies as well as neurological and circulatory diseases.

Unit Group 2391

Medical Imaging Professionals operate radiation producing and other imaging equipment for diagnostic, monitoring or treatment purposes, under the direction of a radiologist or other medical practitioner.

A Naturopath treats internal health problems, metabolic disorders and imbalances, through treatment of the whole person, using natural therapies.

Occupation 239413

An Acupuncturist treats disorders and illnesses by stimulating the body's defence mechanisms through fine needle insertions into the skin.

Occupation 239479

A Natural Therapy Professional nec diagnoses and treats diseases, ailments and injuries using natural therapies, and advises on preventive measures.

Unit Group 2399

Other Health Professionals this unit group includes all health professionals not elsewhere classified.

Occupation 239911

An Audiologist provides diagnostic assessments and rehabilitative service related to human hearing defects.

Occupation 239913

An Orthoptist diagnoses and manages eye movement disorders and associated sensory deficiencies.

Occupation 239915

An Orthotist designs, builds, fits and repairs splints, braces, callipers and related appliances to restore functions or compensate for muscular or skeletal disabilities.

Occupation 239979

A Health Professional nec diagnoses and treats health-related conditions in order to promote or restore good health.

Sub-Major Group 24

Education Professionals educate students in pre-primary, primary, secondary, tertiary, private or special institutions by teaching one or more of a range of subjects to students, research and develop curricula and teaching materials, and promote students' social, emotional, intellectual and physical development.

Unit Group 2411

Pre-Primary School Teachers teach the basics of numeracy, literacy, music, art and literature to students at pre primary schools and promote students' social, emotional, intellectual and physical development.

Occupation 241111

A Pre-Primary School Teacher teaches the basics of numeracy, literacy, music, art and literature to students at pre-primary schools and promotes students' social, emotional, intellectual and physical development.

Occupation 241479

A Special Education Teacher educates students within a prescribed curriculum, in order to promote their social, emotional, intellectual and physical development.

A Dance Teacher (Private) teaches students the practice, theory and performance of dance, in private training establishments.

Occupation 249117

A Drama Teacher (Private) teaches students in the practice, theory and performance of drama, in private training establishments.

Occupation 249179

An Extra-Systemic Teacher nec teaches students in the practice, theory and performance of a particular subject or discipline.

Psychologists investigate, assess and provide treatment or counselling to foster optimal, personal, social, educational or occupational adjustment and development.

Occupation 251411

A Clinical Psychologist consults with individuals and groups, assesses psychological disorders and administers programs of treatment.

Occupation 251413

An Educational Psychologist investigates learning and teaching, and develops psychological techniques to foster the development and skills of individuals and groups in educational settings.

Occupation 251415

Organisational Psychologist applies psychological principles and techniques to study occupational behaviour, working conditions, and organisational structure, and solves problems of work performance and organisational design.

Occupation 251479

A Psychologist nec investigates, assesses and provides treatment or counselling to foster optimal personal, social, educational, or occupational adjustment and development.

Unit Group 2515

Ministers of Religion perform spiritual functions associated with beliefs and practices of religious faiths and provide motivation, guidance and training in religious life for the people of a congregation, parish or community.

Occupation 251511

A Minister of Religion performs spiritual functions associated with the beliefs and practices of a religious faith and motivates, guides and trains a congregation, parish or community to live and develop their faith.

Unit Group 2521

Legal Professionals provide legal advice, prepare and draft legal documents, conduct negotiations on behalf of clients and plead cases before civil, criminal and industrial courts and other tribunals.

Occupation 252111

A Barrister pleads cases before civil, criminal and industrial courts and other tribunals.

Occupation 252113

Occupation 253111

A Fashion Designer designs garments and accessories by pursuing original ideas or adopting existing styles.

Occupation 253313

A Graphic Designer designs and presents information in a visual form for print, film, television, signs, video and computers.

Occupation 253315

An Industrial Designer develops and implements designs for commercial and industrial products.

Occupation 253317

An Interior Designer plans and designs interiors for buildings, offices and homes, with consideration to layout, function, aesthetics and safety.

Occupation 253319

An Illustrator draws and paints pictures that assist in presentation and meaning, and explains narrative, dialogue and ideas.

Unit Group 2534

Journalists and Related Professionals write and edit news reports, commentaries and feature stories for presentation by print or electronic media or compose written material to advertise products or services.

Occupation 253411

An Editor plans and directs editing of publications such as newspapers, magazines and journals prior to printing and distribution.

Occupation 253413

A Print Journalist collects and analyses facts about newsworthy events by interview, investigation or observation and writes stories for newspapers, magazines and journals.

Occupation 253415

A Television Journalist collects and analyses facts about newsworthy events by interview, investigation, or observation and writes stories for television news or public affairs programs.

Occupation 253417

A Radio Journalist collects and analyses facts about newsworthy events by interview, investigation, or observation and writes stories for radio news or current affairs programs.

Occupation 253419

A Copywriter designs and composes written material to advertise products or services.

Occupation 253421

A Technical Writer researches and writes information-based material for articles, manuals, text books, handbooks and other multi-media products, usually for educational or corporate purposes.

Occupation 253479

Journalist and Related Professionals nec prepares written material for publication.

Unit Group 2535

Authors and Related Professionals write, edit and evaluate literary works for publication and scripts for radio, television, stage and film productions.

Occupation 253511

An Author produces written work for publication or performance.

Occupation 253513

A Book Editor evaluates manuscripts of books to determine suitability for publication and supervises final manuscript preparation.

Occupation 253515

A Script Editor edits and supervises the preparation of script material for radio, television, stage or film productions.

Unit Group 2536

Film, Television, Radio and Stage Directors direct the overall or specific aspects of the production of film, television, radio and stage productions.

Occupation 253611

An Art Director (Film, Television or Stage) plans, organises and controls artistic aspects of film stage or television productions.

Occupation 253613

A Director (Film, Television, Radio or Stage) interprets and approves selection of scripts, and directs and instructs cast and crew in the filming or performance of productions.

A Cement Production Plant Operator operates plant and equipment to produce cement, lime and clinker.

A Concrete Batching Plant Operator operates mixing plant to produce batches of concrete from cement, sand, aggregate, water and other ingredients.

A Water and Waste Water Plant Operator operates plant and equipment to store, distribute and purify water, and to remove wastes from waste water.

Occupation 712923

Bulk Materials Handling Plant Operator operates equipment to load, unload, move, store or stack bulk materials such as grain, sugar or mineral ore.

Occupation 712979

An Intermediate Stationary Plant Operator nec operates a range of stationary plant such as weighbridges, lighthouses, crematoria, and timber treatment.

Sub-Major Group 72

Intermediate Machine Operators operate stationary processing machines.

Unit Group 7211

Sewing Machinists operate a range of industrial sewing machines to sew and finish garments, curtains and soft furnishings.

Occupation 721101

A Supervisor, Sewing Machinists supervises and co-ordinates the activities of sewing machinists.

Occupation 721111

A Sewing Machinist operates industrial sewing machines to sew and finish garments, curtains and soft furnishings.

Unit Group 7212

Textile and Footwear Production Machine Operators operate machines to process raw textile fibres, raw hides and skins for use in textile and footwear production and dye, weave and knit fibres, and fabricate footwear.

Occupation 721201

A Supervisor, Textile and Footwear Production Machinery Operators supervises and co-ordinates the activities of textile and footwear production machine operators.

Occupation 721211

A Yarn Carding and Spinning Machine Operator operates machines to convert raw textile fibers into continuous untwisted or twisted strands of yarn for use in clothing, carpet, curtains or other fabrics.

Occupation 721213

A Weaving Machine Operator operates looms to weave yarn into cloth, carpet or other fabrics.

Occupation 721215

A Knitting Machine Operator operates machines to knit fabrics, garment parts, or other articles from yarn such as cotton, wool, nylon or rayon.

Occupation 721217

A Textile Dyeing and Finishing Machine Operator operates machinery to bleach, dye, and finish knitted garments such as hosiery and woollen garments.

Occupation 721219

Road and Rail Transport Drivers drive trucks, buses, trams, cars and trains to transport passengers and goods.

Unit Group 7311

Truck Drivers drive furniture removal vans and heavy trucks to transport goods and materials.

Occupation 731111

A Heavy Truck Driver drives heavy trucks to transport goods and materials.

Occupation 731113

A Furniture Removalist drives removal vans or large trucks and moves household and office furniture and equipment between locations.

Unit Group 7312

Bus and Tram Drivers drive buses or trams to transport passengers over established or special routes or urban tramway systems.

Occupation 731211

A Bus Driver drives buses to transport passengers over established or special routes.

Occupation 731213

A Tram Driver drives trams to transport passengers on urban tramway systems.

Unit Group 7313

Automobile Drivers drive motor cars to transport passengers to destinations.

Occupation 731311

An Automobile Driver drives registered taxis or other motor cars to transport passengers to destinations.

Unit Group 7314

Delivery Drivers drive vans or cars to deliver goods or materials, or to act as messenger or courier.

Occupation 731411

A Delivery Driver drives vans or motor cars to transport goods or materials, or to act as messengers or couriers.

Unit Group 7315

Train Drivers and Assistants drive locomotives or self-propelled rolling stock as part of a railway system.

Occupation 731511

A Train Driver drives locomotives or self-propelled rolling stock as part of a railway system.

Occupation 731513

A Train Driver's Assistant under direction performs routine railway driving tasks, and receives instruction and training in locomotive driving.

Sub-Major Group 79

Other Intermediate Production and Transport Workers this sub-major group includes all intermediate production workers not elsewhere classified.

Unit Group 7911

Miners operate equipment to excavate, load and transport coal, ore and rock either underground or in open cut mines.

Occupation 791111

A Miner operates equipment to excavate, load and transport coal, ore and rock either underground or in open-cut mines.

Unit Group 7912

Blasting Workers assemble, position and detonate explosives at mining sites.

Occupation 791211

A Blasting Worker assembles, positions and detonates explosives at mining sites.

Unit Group 7913

Structural Steel Construction Workers erect scaffolding, position and secure steel reinforcing in concrete forms, erect and dismantle steel structural frames and assemble rigging gear to move and position machinery and structural components.

Occupation 791311

A Scaffolder erects and dismantles scaffolding to provide work platforms on building or industrial sites, or for temporary structures such as stages and seating.

Occupation 791313

A Steel Fixer positions and secures steel bars or steel mesh in concrete forms to reinforce concrete structures.

Occupation 791315

A Structural Steel Erector erects and dismantles structural steel frames of buildings or other structures.

Occupation 791317

A Construction Rigger assembles and installs rigging gear such as cables, ropes, pulleys and winches to lift, lower, move or position machinery, structural steel or other heavy objects.

Unit Group 7914

Insulation and Home Improvements Installers install functional or decorative fittings, or install and apply a variety of insulation materials to improve resistance to heat, cold, air, sound or moisture, in established buildings and those under construction.

Occupation 791411

A Building Insulation Installer installs and applies insulating material such as foam, granules, foil, batts or blankets to walls, floors, and ceilings of buildings to insulate against heat, cold, air, sound or moisture.

Occupation 791413

A Home Improvements Installer installs functional and decorative home improvements such as awnings, curtains, blinds, flyscreens, garage doors, exterior cladding, shower screens and prefabricated windows and doors.

Unit Group 7991

Motor Vehicle Parts and Accessories Fitters fit and replace accessories on motor vehicles using specialised machines and equipment.

Occupation 799111

A Motor Vehicle Parts and Accessories Fitter fits and replaces accessories on motor vehicles using specialised machines and equipment.

Unit Group 7992

Product Quality Controllers examine manufactured products or primary produce to ensure conformity to specifications and standards of presentation and quality.

Occupation 799211

A Product Examiner examines products to ensure conformity to specifications and standards of presentation and quality.

Occupation 799213

A Product Grader grades primary produce by evaluating individual items or batches in terms of established standards and records results.

Occupation 799215

A Product Tester collects product samples, conduct tests to determine quality of produce and maintains records of results.

Unit Group 7993

Storepersons receive, handle and despatch goods in stores or warehouses.

Occupation 799301

A Supervisor, Storepersons supervises and co-ordinates the activities of storepersons.

Occupation 799311

A Storeperson receives, handles and despatches goods in stores or warehouses.

Unit Group 7994

Seafarers and Fishing Hands maintain ships' equipment and structures, and catch fish, crustaceans and molluscs.

Occupation 799411

A Seafarer and Fishing Hand performs maintenance and lookout tasks aboard ships including ferries, tugs and barges.

Occupation 799413

A Fishing Hand catches fish, crustaceans and molluscs in ocean and inland waters.

Unit Group 7995

Forestry and Logging Workers perform manual tasks associated with felling trees, logging, cultivating and maintaining natural and plantation forests.

Occupation 799501

A Supervisor, Forestry and Logging Workers supervises and co-ordinates the activities of forestry and logging workers.

Occupation 799511

A Tree Faller fells trees and trims and saws them into logs.

Occupation 799513

A Forestry Worker assists in the cultivation, maintenance and protection of forests.

Occupation 799515

A Logging Assistant assists in the logging, felling and sawing of trees.

Unit Group 7996

Printing Hands operate bindery machines and perform manual binding and finishing of books and printed products or carry out routine printing tasks.

Occupation 799611

A Printing Table Hand operates bindery machines and performs manual binding and finishing of books and printed products or carry out routine printing tasks.

Occupation 799613

A Printer's Assistant performs routine tasks to assist in the production of printed materials.

Major Group 8

Elementary Clerical, Sales and Service Workers perform a range of clerical, sales and service tasks, usually under supervision, within established routines and procedures.

Sub-Major Group 81

Elementary Clerks receive, process and send mail, documents and information, operate telecommunication switchboards, and receive and process bets.

Unit Group 8111

Registry and Filing Clerks process and handle information and documents to maintain access to and security of databases or records management systems.

Occupation 811111

A Registry or Filing Clerk processes and handles information and documents to maintain access to and security of databases or records management systems.

Unit Group 8112

Mail Sorting Clerks receive or collect, process and despatch mail at sorting centres and post offices.

Occupation 811211

A Mail Clerk collects, processes and despatches mail in an organisation.

Occupation 811213

A Postal Sorting Officer receives, processes and despatches mail within a post office.

Unit Group 8113

Switchboard Operators operate telecommunication switchboards and consoles to assist callers establish telephone connections or to receive customer inquiries or fault reports.

Occupation 811311

A Switchboard Operator operates telecommunication switchboards and consoles to assist callers establish telephone connections or to receive customer inquiries or fault reports.

Unit Group 8114

Messengers deliver goods, documents, messages, mail and other items.

Occupation 811411

A Courier delivers goods, documents or messages.

Occupation 811413

A Postal Delivery Officer sorts and delivers mail.

Unit Group 8115

Betting Clerks take bets from customers either at a betting agency or over the phone, and assist bookmakers to provide betting services at race meetings.

Occupation 811511

A Betting Agency Counter Clerk handles customer bets, payments and payouts over the counter, for horse and dog racing and other competitive sport or recreation events.

Occupation 811513

A Telephone Betting Clerk records customer's bets and account details over the phone, for horse and dog racing and other competitive sport or recreation events.

Occupation 811515

A Bookmaker's Clerk assists bookmakers to provide betting services at race meetings.

Occupation 811579

A Betting Clerk nec enters bets from customers in keno terminals in hotels or licensed clubs, and call bingo games or related duties.

Unit Group 8116

Office Trainees work and study to learn the skills of a clerical worker.

Occupation 811611

Office Trainee works and studies to learn the skills of a clerical worker.

Unit Group 8119

Other Elementary Clerks this unit group includes all elementary clerks not elsewhere classified.

Occupation 811911

A Meter Reader reads electric, gas or water meters and records usage.

Occupation 811913

A Classified Advertising Clerk receives and records advertising copy for publication or broadcasting.

Occupation 811915

An Interviewer interviews people and records their responses to survey questions on various topics.

Occupation 811917

A Parking Inspector patrols assigned areas and issues parking infringement notices to vehicles that are illegally parked.

Occupation 811979

Elementary Clerk nec undertakes basic clerical duties not elsewhere covered in the ASCO classification.

Sub-Major Group 82

Elementary Sales Workers sell goods and services in retail and wholesale establishments and operate checkouts and perform routine financial transactions in retail, entertainment and office environments.

Unit Group 8211

Sales Assistants sell stock such as food, clothing, hardware, household appliances, office supplies and cosmetics in retail or wholesale establishments.

Occupation 821111

A Sales Assistant (Food and Drink Products) sells food and drink products in retail or wholesale establishments.

Occupation 821113

A Sales Assistant (Fabric, Clothing and Footwear) sells soft furnishings, manchester, clothing or footwear in retail or wholesale establishments.

Occupation 821115

A Sales Assistant (Other Personal and Household Goods) sells stock such as household appliances, office supplies and cosmetics in retail or wholesale establishments.

Occupation 821117

A Sales Assistant (Postal Services) serves customers by advising on postal rates and sells postal products such as stamps, envelopes and philatelic products at a post office or postal agency.

Occupation 821179

A Sales Assistant nec sells goods or services in retail or wholesale establishments such as video libraries.

Unit Group 8291

Checkout Operators and Cashiers operate cash registers and receive payment for goods purchased by customers or receive and bank takings and make payments.

Occupation 829111

A Checkout Operator operates cash registers and receives payment for goods purchased by customers.

Occupation 829113

An Office Cashier receives and banks takings and makes payments.

Unit Group 8292

Ticket Salespersons sell tickets or make reservations for facilities and services such as travel or admission to sporting and entertainment venues or collect fares on transport vehicles.

Occupation 829211

A Ticket Seller sells tickets or make reservations for facilities and services such as travel or admission to sporting or entertainment venues.

Occupation 829213

A Transport Conductor collects fares and issues tickets on transport vehicles.

Unit Group 8293

Street Vendors and Related Workers sell goods and services at street or market locations, on established routes or door-to-door.

Occupation 829311

A Street Vendor promotes and sells goods and services to customers at street locations.

Occupation 829313

A Cash Van Salesperson drives van or truck on established routes to deliver and sell goods and services.

Occupation 829315

A Door-to-Door Salesperson sells merchandise or services from door to door.

Unit Group 8294

Telemarketers telephone customers and prospective customers to promote products and services and obtain sales or arrange sales visits.

Occupation 829411

A Telemarketer telephones customers and prospective customers to promote goods and services and obtains sales or arranges sales visits.

Unit Group 8295

Sales Demonstrators and Models demonstrate goods at commercial premises, exhibitions, or private homes or model garments and other merchandise or pose for art.

Occupation 829511

A Sales Demonstrator displays and demonstrates goods at commercial premises and exhibitions.

Occupation 829513

A Model models garments and other merchandise or poses for photographs, paintings sculptures and other types of art.

Unit Group 8296

Service Station Attendants sell fuel, lubricants, automotive accessories, snack foods and other items at service stations.

Occupation 829611

A Service Station Attendant sells fuel, lubricants and other automotive accessories, and performs minor maintenance on motor vehicles at service stations.

Unit Group 8297

Sales and Service Trainees work and study to learn the skills of a sales or service worker.

Occupation 829711

A Sales and Service Trainee works and studies to learn the skills of a sales or service worker.

Unit Group 8299

Other Elementary Sales Workers this unit group includes all elementary sales workers not elsewhere classified.

Occupation 829911

A Rental Salesperson rents equipment or items to individuals, businesses or commercial organisations.

Occupation 829913

A Materials Recycler salvages, sorts and stores materials for re-sale to consumers or for industrial recycling.

Occupation 829979

Elementary Sales Worker nec sells lottery tickets and entries in games of chance or other goods not covered elsewhere in the ASCO classification.

Sub-Major Group 83

Elementary Service Workers provide basic services in relation to security, entertainment and personal and domestic needs.

Unit Group 8311

Guards and Security Officers patrol and guard properties such as industrial and commercial premises, or provide armed escort services for the transport of cash and other valuables.

Occupation 831111

A Security Officer patrols and guards industrial and commercial property, railway yards, stations and other facilities.

Occupation 831113

An Armoured Car Escort provides armed escort services for transportation and delivery of cash and other valuables.

Occupation 831179

A Guard and Security Officer nec provides security services not covered by other security occupations.

Unit Group 8312

Ushers, Porters and Related Workers welcome patrons, collect tickets and usher patrons to their seats at entertainment, sporting or recreational venues, or assist guests by carrying luggage and attending to their needs.

Occupation 831211

A Ticket Collector or Usher collects tickets or admission passes and ushers patrons to their seats at entertainment, sporting or recreational venues.

Occupation 831213

A Luggage Porter or Doorperson assists guests in accommodation establishments and passengers in transport terminals by attending to and carrying luggage, escorting guests, welcoming them and attending to their general needs.

Unit Group 8313

Domestic Housekeepers perform cleaning and housekeeping tasks in private homes.

Occupation 831311

A Domestic Housekeeper performs cleaning and housekeeping duties in private homes.

Unit Group 8314

Caretakers maintain and clean residential buildings, schools, offices, holiday camps, caravan parks and associated grounds.

Occupation 831411

A Caretaker maintains and cleans residential buildings, schools, offices, holiday camps, caravan parks and associated grounds.

Unit Group 8315

Laundry Workers sort, clean, fold, iron and package clothing or other items in laundry establishments.

Occupation 831511

A Laundry Worker cleans, loads and unloads, folds, irons and packages clothing or other items in a laundry establishment.

Unit Group 8319

Other Elementary Service Workers this unit group includes all elementary service workers not elsewhere classified.

Occupation 831911

A Railways Assistant assists in the operation and maintenance of facilities at railway stations.

Occupation 831913

A Hair and Beauty Salon Assistant assists hairdressers by performing routine tasks in a hairdressing or beauty salon.

Occupation 831915

A Sterilisation Technology Worker cleans, sterilises and packages surgical instruments and other hospital equipment, soft goods and linen in sterilisation service departments.

Occupation 831917

A Car Park Attendant operates and maintains car parking facilities.

Occupation 831919

A Crossing Supervisor assists children and other pedestrians to cross roads.

Occupation 831921

A Trolley Collector collects supermarket trolleys from car parks and returns them to supermarkets or variety stores.

Occupation 831923

A Leaflet and Newspaper Deliverer delivers newspapers or leaflets to homes.

Occupation 831925

Examination Supervisor supervises students sitting examinations.

Occupation 831927

A Prostitute or Escort provides clients with social companionship or sexual services.

Occupation 831979

Elementary Service Worker nec undertakes other basic service duties not elsewhere covered in the ASCO classification.

Major Group 9

Labourers and Related Workers perform routine tasks usually working under close supervision.

Sub-Major Group 91

Cleaners clean construction sites, commercial, industrial and domestic premises or industrial machinery and vehicles using portable cleaning equipment and may specialise in cleaning particular surfaces, such as carpet and glass.

Unit Group 9111

Cleaners clean construction sites, commercial, industrial and domestic premises or industrial machinery and vehicles using portable cleaning equipment and may specialise in cleaning particular surfaces, such as carpet and glass.

Occupation 911111

A Commercial Cleaner cleans industrial work areas, industrial machinery, commercial premises, residential complexes, hospitals and construction sites using heavy duty cleaning equipment.

Occupation 911113

A Domestic Cleaner cleans and tidies homes.

Occupation 911115

A Carpet Cleaner cleans carpets, rugs and furniture upholstery.

Occupation 911117

A Vehicle Cleaner washes, dusts, scrubs and polishes interiors and exteriors of cars, trucks, buses or railway cars, including detailing.

Occupation 911119

A Window Cleaner cleans interior and exterior window surfaces.

Occupation 911179

A Cleaner nec carries out cleaning duties not covered by other cleaning occupations.

Sub-Major Group 92

Factory Labourers perform routine tasks in product assembly or in the processing and packaging of food and other manufactured products, usually working under close supervision.

Unit Group 9211

Engineering Production Process Workers perform routine tasks to assist tradespersons in metalworking or product assembly, usually working under close supervision.

Occupation 921111

Engineering Production Process Worker performs routine tasks to assist tradespersons in metalworking or product assembly, either manually or using hand tools and appliances, usually working under close supervision.

Unit Group 9212

Product Assemblers assemble components and sub assemblies of metal products, electrical and electronic equipment, jewellery and precious metal articles, and joinery products, usually working under close supervision.

Occupation 921211

A Product Assembler assembles components and sub-assemblies of metal products, electrical and electronic equipment, jewellery and previous metal articles, and joinery products, usually working under close supervision.

Unit Group 9213

Meat and Fish Process Workers perform routine tasks slaughtering livestock and poultry, eviscerating and trimming carcasses, and processing, grading and packing fish and shellfish.

Occupation 921311

A Meatworks Labourer slaughters livestock and eviscerates carcasses.

Occupation 921313

A Meat Boner and Slicer trims and cuts meat from bones, sides or carcasses.

Occupation 921315

A Poultry Process Worker slaughters poultry and eviscerates carcasses.

Occupation 921317

A Fish Process Worker performs routine tasks in the processing, grading and packing of fish and shellfish.

Unit Group 9214

Other Food Factory Hands this unit group includes all food factory hands not elsewhere classified.

Occupation 921411

A Food and Drink Processing Machine Attendant controls food or drink processing machines or operates equipment in mills and refineries to process, blend or store products.

Occupation 921413

A Baking Factory Hand performs routine tasks in breadrooms of bakeries.

Occupation 921415

A Dairy Factory Hand performs routine tasks in milk processing or cheese making factories.

Occupation 921417

A Fruit and Vegetable Factory Hand performs routine tasks in processing fruit and vegetables.

Occupation 921419

A Food Products Millhand performs routine tasks in milling foods such as sugar or grain.

Occupation 921479

A Food Factory Hand nec performs routine tasks in processing food products.

Unit Group 9215

Wood Products Factory Hands perform routine tasks in sawmills, timber yards, wood processing and timber products factories, and pulp and paper mills.

Occupation 921511

A Sawmill Labourer performs routine tasks in sawmills.

Occupation 921513

A Timberyard Labourer performs routine tasks in timber yards.

Occupation 921515

A Wood and Wood Products Factory Hand performs routine tasks in wood processing and timber product factories.

Occupation 921517

A Pulp and Paper Mill General Hand performs routine tasks in pulp and paper mills.

Unit Group 9219

Other Process Workers this unit group includes all process workers not elsewhere classified.

Occupation 921911

A Cement and Concrete Plant Labourer performs routine tasks in cement and concrete manufacturing plants and factories.

Occupation 921913

A Clay Processing Factory Hand performs routine tasks in clay processing factories.

Occupation 921915

A Chemical Plant Labourer performs routine tasks in chemical processing plants.

Occupation 921917

A Rubber and Plastics Factory Hand performs routine tasks in rubber and plastic factories.

Occupation 921919

A Hide and Skin Processing Labourer performs routine tasks in leather, skin and hide tanning and finishing factories.

Occupation 921921

A Glass Processing Labourer performs routine tasks in the production of glassware.

Occupation 921923

A Fabric and Textile Factory Hand performs routine tasks in fabric and textile factories.

Occupation 921925

A Footwear Factory Hand performs routine tasks in shoe factories.

Occupation 921979

A Process Worker performs routine processing tasks in manufacturing plants and factories.

Unit Group 9221

Hand Packers weigh, wrap, seal and label meat, fruit, vegetables or other products by hand.

Occupation 922111

A Hand Packer weighs, wraps, seals and labels meat, fruit, vegetables or other products by hand.

Unit Group 9222

Packers and Container Fillers fill and seal containers with products such as food, drinks, paints, oils and lotions and package the filled containers.

Occupation 922211

A Packager and Container Filler fills and seals products such as food, drinks, paints, oils and lotions and packages the filled containers.

Sub-Major Group 99

Other Labourers and Related Workers this sub-major group includes all labourers and related workers not elsewhere classified.

Unit Group 9911

Mining Support Workers and Driller's Assistants perform routine tasks on mining or drilling sites and in mineral ore treating operations, usually working under close supervision.

Occupation 991111

A Mining Support Worker performs routine tasks in mining and mineral ore treating operations, usually under close supervision.

Occupation 991113

A Driller's Assistant performs routine tasks in setting up and operating a drilling site for oil, gas, mineral ore or water, usually working under close supervision.

Unit Group 9912

Earthmoving Labourers perform tasks in excavating earth, clearing and levelling sites, and digging irrigation channels.

Occupation 991211

Earthmoving Labourer performs labouring tasks in excavating earth, clearing and levelling sites, and digging irrigation channels.

Unit Group 9913

Paving and Surfacing Labourers perform routine tasks to spread, level and compact bituminous and other paving material on roads, runways or parking areas.

Occupation 991311

A Paving and Surfacing Labourer performs routine labouring tasks to spread, level and compact bituminous and other paving material on roads, runways or parking areas.

Unit Group 9914

Survey Hands perform routine tasks to assist surveyors or geologists.

Occupation 991411

A Survey Hand performs routine tasks to assist surveyors or geologists.

Unit Group 9915

Railway Labourers lay and repair tracks for railways, tramways, quarries and mines and install and repair signals and other equipment.

Occupation 991511

A Railway Labourer lays and repairs tracks for railways, tramways, transfer yards, quarries and mines.

Unit Group 9916

Construction and Plumber's Assistants perform routine tasks on building and construction sites and assist plumbers in the installation and maintenance of piping systems, fixtures and water regulators.

Occupation 991611

A Construction Assistant assists building tradespersons to erect and repair structures and facilities on building and construction sites and in factories producing prefabricated building components.

Occupation 991613

A Plumber's Assistant performs tasks involved in the fabrication, laying, installation and maintenance of pipes, fixtures, water meters and regulators.

Unit Group 9917

Concreters pour, spread, smooth and finish concrete for structures such as floors, stairs, ramps, footpaths and bridges.

Occupation 991711

A Concreter pours, spreads, smooths and finishes concrete for structures such as floors, stairs, ramps, footpaths and bridges.

Unit Group 9918

Electrical and Telecommunications Trades Assistants assist electrical and telecommunications tradespersons to install and maintain electrical and telecommunications systems, usually working under close supervision.

Occupation 991811

Electrical or Telecommunications Trades Assistant performs routine tasks in the installation and maintenance of electrical and telecommunications systems, usually working under close supervision.

Unit Group 9919

Other Mining, Construction and Related Labourers this unit group includes all mining, construction and related workers not elsewhere classified.

Occupation 991911

A Lagger applies insulating materials, such as asbestos, felt, fibreglass, polyurethane and cork, to pipes, steam generators, process vats or ducting.

Occupation 991913

A Crane Chaser slings and directs the movement of loads handled by cranes or winches in locations such as manufacturing plants and construction sites.

Occupation 991915

A Fence Erector erects and repairs fences and gates.

Unit Group 9921

Farm Hands perform routine tasks to assist in plant cultivation and animal production in various types of agricultural establishments.

Occupation 992111

A General Farm Hand performs routine tasks to assist in plant cultivation and animal production on grain and livestock farms.

Occupation 992113

A Fruit, Vegetable or Nut Farm Hand performs routine tasks in crop production on fruit, vegetable and nut farms, market gardens and orchards.

Occupation 992115

A Stud Hand or Stable Hand assists with maintaining and cleaning stables and handling horses and other stud animals.

Occupation 992117

A Shearing Shed Hand regulates the flow of sheep to be shorn, keeps the shearing shed clean and tidy and assists with classing the wool.

Occupation 992179

A Farm Hand nec performs routine tasks to assist in plant cultivation and animal production, including fish farms and apiaries.

Unit Group 9922

Nursery and Garden Labourers perform routine tasks to assist with the planting, cultivation and harvesting of trees and plants in a plant nursery or assist with the cultivation and maintenance of gardens.

Occupation 992211

A Horticultural Nursery Assistant assists with the planting, cultivation and harvesting of trees and plants in a plant nursery.

Occupation 992213

A Garden Labourer assists with the cultivation and maintenance of gardens.

Unit Group 9929

Other Agricultural and Horticultural Labourers this unit group includes all agricultural and horticultural labourers not elsewhere classified.

Occupation 992911

A Shooter-Trapper hunts, traps or shoots animals for food, pelts, research or pest control.

Occupation 992913

A Rural Trainee works and studies to learn the skills of a farm worker.

Occupation 992979

An Agricultural and Horticultural Labourer nec performs routine tasks such as gathering seagrass, kelp, coral or seeds, and turning irrigation on and off.

Unit Group 9931

Kitchenhands assist kitchen and service staff in the preparation and service of food, and clean food preparation and service areas.

Occupation 993111

A Kitchenhand assists kitchen and service staff in the preparation and service of food, and cleans food preparation and service areas.

Unit Group 9932

Fast Food Cooks prepare a restricted range of foods in fast food establishments.

Occupation 993211
